## WHL prospect faces impaired driving charges

CRIME • Investigators have laid criminal charges against a top Western Hockey League prospect involved in a fatal crash west of Calgary.

The 17-year-old player, whose identity is protected by the Youth Criminal Justice Act, has been charged with impaired driving causing death, dangerous driving causing death and refusing to provide a breath sample.

The teen was behind the wheel of a car that rolled on Springbank Road on the morning of April 30, killing his passenger, Emily Matthewson.

Matthewson, 18, was a teaching student from Regina.

The Youth Criminal Justice Act also prevents publishing details of the team the accused played for, but he was widely expected to be selected in the early rounds of the NHL entry draft later this month.
